PASTOR PAUL'S PONDERINGS

Saturday greetings to you all and especially to those arriving in the Park today! ,As they say in horse races, "And down the stretch they come!" and we are heading down the stretch in the summer of 2023! It's hard to believe this first summer as your "Park Pastor" is so rapidly coming to a conclusion. It's been a wonderful summer for Jan and me enjoying the blessings of wonderful people in a special place!

Speaking of time going by quickly, I had a phone call yesterday from one of my college roommates from Gordon College. He was calling to ask if I was planning to attend Homecoming this year in recognition of our graduation 45 years ago--45 years ago!! I must confess I had not stopped to think about it at all. I was more aware of my 50-year high school reunion taking place next year. My how time flies!

Our graduation speaker at Gordon 45 years ago was Charles Colson, fresh out of prison from his Watergate misdeeds in the early 70's and starting his new calling as the founder of Prison Fellowship. Just last week I received an email from the Colson Center for Christian Worldview describing Chuck's coming to faith and subsequent transition to become one of the most influential leaders in Christian circles for the remainder of his life. In part, that email conveyed these thoughts he had about his life journey:

The truth that is uppermost in my mind today is that God isn't finished. As long as we're alive, He's at work in our lives. We can live lives of obedience in any field because God providentially arranges the circumstances of our lives to achieve His objectives. And that leads to the greatest joy I've found in life. As I look back on my life, it's not having been to Buckingham Palace to receive the Templeton Prize or getting honorary degrees or writing books. The greatest joy is to see how God has used my life to touch the lives of others, people hurting and in need.

Those are words we can all reflect on and benefit from. God is not finished with us yet! He is at work in our lives and can providentially use us for God's glory in any field—teachers, students, lawyers, social workers, doctors and nurses, engineers, salespeople, landscapers, financial advisors, law enforcement and first responders, even retirees and school bus drivers! Christians are all called to ministry! Wherever we go, God is sending us and using us to touch the lives of others in (hopefully) positive ways! As summer comes to a close and many of us return to a "normal" schedule, we need to remember we are all called as people of faith to be God's servants in whatever we do, making an impact in the world wherever God has placed us. We too can experience the great joy Chuck describes as God works through us wherever we



are! Think about that this week as you enjoy your time at Linwood !
