

And You Thought Linwood Gets Busy On Holiday Weekends

This snippet was found in a 30-year-old copy of *the Breeze*:

In 1882 (two years before Linwood was purchased by the Evangelical Association), the Erie County Farmers Association held a picnic at Linwood Grove.

Two steamers arrived, each carrying 2,000 – 3,000 people, and these folks joined the crowd from the surrounding area, making a crowd estimated at 10,000 people! (What do you suppose they did for bathrooms?)

The older folks listened to speeches while the younger ones were "either amused at the dancing-hall or engaged in flirtations on the beach."

FROM PASTOR CHRIS SCRUGGS

Dear Friends:

As I write this, Kathy and I are soon to return to Linwood Park for the final few weeks of the summer. We cannot wait to see you all once again.

This Sunday, the focus of worship is going to be the commandment of Jesus to "love one another" found in the Gospel of John and in his letters. When I teach on love, I remind readers that English has only one word for love, while Greek has several. As a result, we always have some notion of attractiveness when we talk about love. In Greek, and especially in Biblical Greek, the word Paul uses has nothing to do with attractiveness or desirability. It has to do with commitment, faithfulness, and willingness to sacrifice for another person. The love of which Jesus speaks is the love shown on the cross.

Psalms in particular refers many times to God's "Steadfast Love." The word "steadfast" means unwavering, continual, unmoving, or firm in the midst of challenge. The word comes from "Steade" in Middle English, from which we get our word "Steady." When I get on a horse, I sometimes pat the horse and say, "Steady," by which I mean "Don't move around." God's love is always steady. It does not move around or change unexpectedly. It is not unstable, but a source of stability for us and our lives. That is the kind of love God wants us to show others.

The theme this summer has been "Life Together." The theme comes from a book that Bonhoeffer wrote for his students during the Second World War. Their life together was marked by difficulty, danger, and even death. One of those who was with Bonhoeffer during the last days of his life remarked upon his unfailing concern for others during this period. People who share God's love with other people in business, in government, in

family, and in day-to-day interactions make a difference in their lives. The biggest difference we can make in the lives of others is to share God's steadfast, self-giving love with them.
