# The Simple Life

This week's theme is the Joy we find in Simplicity. Traditionally, simplicity was one of the virtues, along with faith, hope, love, justice, fortitude, wisdom, humility, and the like. In today's society, there is probably no area of life that we need to ponder more than what it means to live simply.

We all instinctively know that lots of money and lots of possessions do not necessarily make us joyful. Our nation is extremely wealthy, but not extremely joyful. While it is true that we cannot find true joy without some amount of food, clothing, shelter, and the like, more and more food, clothing and shelter do not necessarily make us happy or even contribute to our happiness. The same is true of those of our many other possessions that are not necessities of life.

Jesus never says, "Be Simple." However, Jesus does remark that he does not himself have a lot of possessions and urges us in a number of his parables and teachings to avoid the anxiety and worry that comes from too much attention being paid to possessions. For example, in this week's text, Jesus says to his disciples: "Therefore, I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat; or about your body, what you will wear. For life is more than food, and the body more than clothes" (Luke 12:22-23).

What is this simplicity we desire in our hearts but find so elusive in our day-to-day lives? It is the habit of not having too much. In the last few years, Kathy and I have sold two houses and moved twice. In each of these moves, we downsized. Not so long ago, we looked around our "retirement house," much downsized from our "raise the children and family house," and said to ourselves, "We still have too much." We have downsized and downsized and still have a storeroom of things we will almost certainly never use (except the Christmas decorations, which I refuse to downsize by one decoration.)

Simplicity goes beyond our physical possessions. One of the things age sometimes provides is a simple kind of faith. This does not mean a "simplistic faith." Focusing on the simple essentials, Loving God, Loving Others, and Sharing the Gospel is a simple faith, not a simplistic faith. Just being a simple Christian, loving God and other people, isn't always easy or without complications, but it is a part of wise living.

I hope that the column of the week gives you something to ponder at the beach this week.


