

Don't miss this interactive time together. Pastor Chris will lead us as we look at another text in the book of Luke. No pressure, good conversation!



Iessage From Our Park Paston

THE SPIRITUALITY OF COVID19

In *First Corinthians*, Paul makes an important comment when he shares with the Corinthian Church the following, "Be careful, however, that the exercise of your freedom does not become a stumbling block to the weak" (I Cor. 8:9). Here is the background: As part of Greek religion, animal sacrifices were common. After the animal sacrifice was made, it was common to sell the meat at a discount in the markets. Of course, there were risks associated with eating meat that had been laid out in the sun. In addition, the upper classes looked down upon those who ate such meat. Finally, for early Christians who were serious about their faith, eating food after it had been sacrificed to idols seemed contrary to Christian faith. It was a way of supporting pagan religion.

A great dispute arose over whether or not it was appropriate for Christians to eat such meat. Tempers flared and there were arguments. As in many other areas of faith and practice, this issue became divisive in the Corinthian Church. Paul's response to the problem was first to assure those who ate the meat that, because idols are symbols of gods that did not even exist, there was nothing fundamentally wrong with eating that meat. However, Paul goes on to warn those who were inclined to eat the meat that they should not do so if it caused a weaker brother to sin. He ends his discussion by saying: *Therefore, if what I eat causes my brother or sister to fall into sin, I will never eat meat again, so that I will not cause them to fall.* (I Cor. 8:13).

What does this have to do with wearing masks or not wearing masks in Linwood Park? As Christians, we believe that the greatest of all virtues is love. When the Bible uses the term "Agape" for "Love," it means the self-sacrificing, self-giving love Christ showed on the cross. It means doing things we don't want to do, don't feel it necessary to do, even things we think might be a bit silly, all for the sake of the other. Jesus died on a cross for us, and we can do a lot of things for other people in gratitude for that great act of love on the part of Christ.

Here at Linwood, we live in an enclosed community where homes are relatively close together. We are constantly together on the beach, outside of our houses, on our porches, and in other places. We have worship services and Bible studies where multiple people are invited to attend. This happens to be my area of concern. As a matter of love for our brothers and sisters, we need to try to remember to wear our masks where we are in close proximity with others. Many of you see me walking every day. You know that I can't walk with my mask on because I will overheat! However, if I come up to talk to someone who is wearing a mask, or in a group where someone is wearing a mask, I try to remember to pull up my mask. (Of course periodically I forget and leave it at the house!) I do this in deference to the feelings of others.

Here at Linwood Park, we have people that have serious diseases and are vulnerable to Covid-19. We have people who are on chemotherapy or having other treatments that compromise their immune systems. We have elderly residents who are at risk because of age. As a matter of loving service to them, we need to be careful, not necessarily for ourselves, but for our brothers and sisters in Christ.

Now a word to those who may have compromised immune systems: If you think that you are at risk, please remember that our services are live-streamed on Sunday, and you may watch them in the safety of your own home. We encourage those who feel any concern at all to feel no pressure to do more than watch the services online.

Please listen to Linwood Radio and read *the Breeze*, which will keep you up to date with the latest religious activities and any changes at Linwood. This week, we are going to worship once again outside the Pavilion near the Stand. The same rules apply this week as last week: **Families should stay at least six feet apart and everyone should wear masks.** If there is rain, the services will be broadcast and there will be no public worship.
