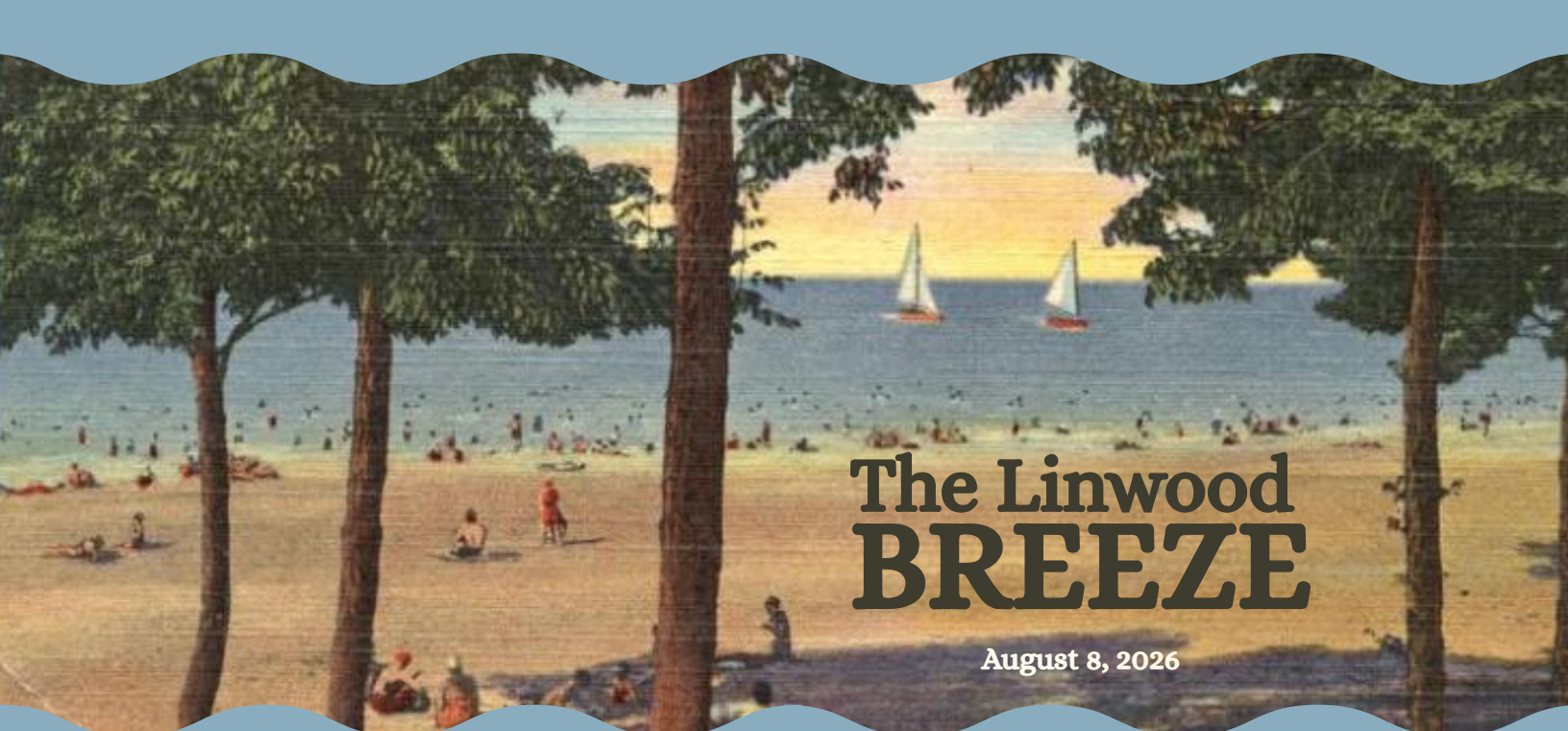

The Vermilion Chamber Foundation is proud to announce the recipient of its inaugural Young Entrepreneur Grant, recognizing 7-year-old Luca Cammarata for his remarkable entrepreneurial spirit, work ethic, and determination.

Luca, who will soon begin second grade at Vermilion Local Schools, is the owner of Luca's Candy Cartel, LLC, a registered Ohio business specializing in refurbished vintage gumball machines. While his father, Vito Cammarata, serves as the business manager, assisting with the legal and administrative responsibilities, Luca is the official owner and the driving force behind the business.

His entrepreneurial journey began at his family's business, West River Paddle Sports in Vermilion, where he learned the value of hard work from his parents, Hallie and Vito. Rather than simply watching, Luca eagerly found ways to help—cleaning kayaks, greeting customers, stocking supplies, and taking the initiative to solve problems on his own. Those early experiences inspired him to launch a business of his own.

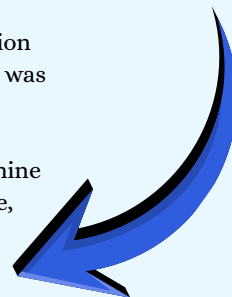
Today, Luca locates vintage gumball machines, carefully refurbishes them, and places them throughout the community, building his business one machine at a time.

In recognition of his initiative, responsibility, and dedication, the Vermilion Chamber Foundation presented Luca with its inaugural Young Entrepreneur Grant in the amount of \$250. The grant was established to encourage and support young entrepreneurs who demonstrate exceptional ambition and a commitment to building their own businesses.

Luca also made a generous contribution of his own by donating a Double Bubble gumball machine to the Vermilion Chamber of Commerce. The machine is now located inside the Chamber office, where visitors can enjoy a gumball for just 25 cents while supporting Luca's growing business. Sidenote - The giant gumball machine in our own Stand was contracted through Luca!!
