Hello Friends,

Summer 2022 is officially here! It arrived on Tuesday this past week, and the weather has certainly seemed to confirm that arrival. My guess is that there are some fresh cases of sunburn along with some great times spent on the beach and enjoying time with family and friends here at Linwood. Jan and I are now better acquainted with Linwood after our first week here. We've so enjoyed meeting and getting to know new friends over that time! Thanks for your warm welcome and Friday evening hospitality at the Welcome Potluck!

Tomorrow, we will continue to explore the "Kingdom of God" theme in our worship time together. Last Sunday we learned that God's plan for his Kingdom people is no secret, God wants to draw people to faith in Jesus Christ! That faith brings a restored relationship with the God who created us, as well as the hope and promise that through faith in Christ and his work in us and through us, we can experience the blessings in life God intends for his children and his creation!

This Sunday, we will once again turn to Matthew 13 and another of Jesus' "The kingdom of heaven is like..." parables shared with his followers. This one, entitled the Parable of Weeds and Wheat (Matthew 13:24-30,36-43), is a stark reminder for us as Kingdom people that we live in a world which is not yet what God intends for it to be. While we know that faith in Christ offers the world peace and joy and blessing, we look around at that world and see much suffering--war, famine, racial and ethnic tensions, political upheaval, dysfunctional family systems, senseless violence, devaluing of human life, persecution of believers, and on and on it goes.

How do we respond as Kingdom people? Do we throw up our hands in frustration and retreat into "safe places" like Linwood where all seems right in the world? Do we go on a holy crusade and do all we can to exact revenge on the evil practices and evil people we see as responsible for all that we feel is wrong in the world? Or is there an option between retreat and revenge which Jesus would offer to his followers?

What's the answer? You can read the verses above in Matthew 13 to begin to understand what Jesus would call us to do, and then come join with others in worship on Sunday as we explore together a bit more of what it means to be Kingdom people in the 21st century. We have the privilege of being able to freely gather and offer our praise and adoration to the One who offers us hope in the midst of challenging times. I hope you will plan to join us!
