I hope you and your loved ones had as wonderful a Memorial Day weekend as I did! As I mentioned, I have attended the Indy 500 with a group of close friends since 1990. This year's race was no exception to the annual excitement—speed, competition, excitement, heartbreak, unexpected twists and turns, pit stops to refuel, some accidents along the way (though all drivers, teams, and fans were thankfully okay), and a thrilling finish. Truly the Greatest Spectacle in Racing!

Scripture compares life to a race, and I think it's an appropriate analogy "...in a race, all the runners run, but only one receives the prize." (1 Cor. 9:24); "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith." (2 Tim. 4:7); "Let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the founder and perfecter of our faith..." (Heb. 12:1-2)

Our lives race by as well, don't they—especially in these hectic times! 
LINWOOD PARK MEMORIAL DAY TAPS ACROSS AMERICA
