

Thursday June 20th – the day I am writing this – is the 2024 Summer Solstice (meaning "sun stands still"), or the longest day of the year in the Northern Hemisphere! That means, due to the tilt of the earth on its axis, the sun rises at its farthest point northeast and sets at its farthest point northwest. That's why we here at Linwood are blessed to be able to both see the sun rise out of Lake Erie to the east, and set into Lake Erie to the west. And, it's the earliest summer solstice since George Washington was President in 1796 – 228 years! (Don't ask me to explain why – google it because it's very complicated!).
