PASTOR PAUL'S PONDERINGS

It's the Saturday before July 4th and The Park is filling with family members and friends who return to Linwood each year at this time to share in the special celebrations taking place over the days ahead! As some of you may not know me, let me take a moment to introduce myself as Linwood's newest Park Pastor.

My wife Jan and I are serving our first full year in this capacity after serving in a temporary role for several weeks last summer. We are from Pittsburgh (Whitehall for you fellow Pittsburghers), and I am a retired Presbyterian pastor. During the school year I drive a school bus in the Keystone Oaks school district as well as singing in the choir and doing occasional preaching at Pleasant Hills Community Presbyterian Church where we worship. In our brief time here, we have grown to love Linwood Park and especially its people! We look forward to meeting new folks during the days and weeks ahead when the Park is at its busiest!
