From the Pen of Pastor Paul...

Linwood Friends,

As we gather in the Chapel this Sunday at 10:45 a.m. for worship, we will continue our summer message series on the Promises of God. Last year, we focused on the 10 Commandments as Pathways of Grace. These commandments offer us the chance to express our gratitude for God's grace and mercy in our lives. By following His commands, we honor and glorify Him and live into the life practices which lead to human flourishing as God intends.

This summer, as we focus on God's Promises, we are in a sense shifting our focus from the opportunity to express our gratitude to God to the privilege we have to enjoy God's blessings offered to us through the different promises God provides his followers. In the first case, we are focusing upward toward God and offering our obedience, with God's help, as a form of worship. Now, we will be focusing on God looking down toward us and offering great promises which can bring peace and hope into our lives. These promises become the foundation for living out our faith in the midst of this fallen world!

This week we start the journey by focusing on God's character and nature as a promise making, promise keeping God. My guess is most, if not all of us, have had situations where someone makes a promise to us and then fails to fulfill it. When that happens, we are left discouraged, disheartened, hurt, or even angry at the betrayal of trust we have placed in that person. We are faced with the challenge of whether or not to trust that person again in the future.

Before we look at the different promises God offers to us as his followers, we must first consider whether or not God's promises are trustworthy. How can we know those promises are reliable? If others have broken their promises to us, how can we know God will not do the same? What if we have felt or experienced an instance of God failing to live up to our expectations? God's promises stand or fall on the bedrock of knowing God's character and nature as a promise making, promise keeping God! So that's where we must begin as we look together at the Promises of God!
