We can be the agents to change the culture of plastics!**

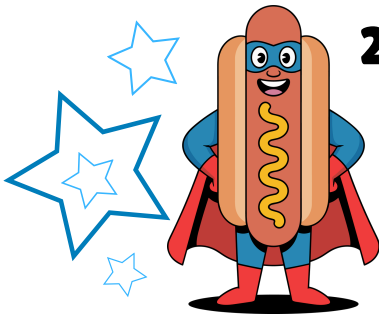
Two screenings and discussions you might want to consider attending at Trinity Lutheran Church on Monday, June 8th.
