THE ANTS GO MARCHING -- AND LEADING US TO BIG CHANGES



There was an "incident" at the Auburn last August. Ants invaded a second-floor bedroom! No one wants to live with ants, and it certainly wasn't fair to ask the Scruggs to put up with that, either. An exterminator was called, the house was sprayed, and that was fortunately the last of the ants.

However, learning what attracted the ants in the first place led to some changes at the Auburn. The ants were attracted to soft rotting wood due to a roof leak sending water down the bedroom wall. After consulting with a roofing contractor, it was decided that the old metal roof that had been tarred over a couple of times needed to be replaced. That improvement was made in early September.

The timing of the needed roof repair coincided with the departure of Chris and Cathy Scruggs and the


arrival of Paul and Jan Thwaite. Chris—always full of ideas and guidance—gave the LCL several suggestions of how the Auburn could be improved to make it more livable. The old air conditioners blocking several of the windows left the cottage dark. They also seemed a bit moldy and cooled the cottage unevenly. With the anticipated arrival of the Thwaites, the bathroom was deemed way too small for them. It always was too small, but the Scruggs tolerated it with their usual southern grace. (In the past you could sit on the toilet and brush your teeth at the same time!)

Bottom line, a project was undertaken to make some much needed upgrades to the Auburn *and* protect the LCL's investment. Several HVAC contractors were asked for suggestions and quotes on installing a heat pump. Those consultations resulted in the installation of a traditional HVAC system outside and in the attic, with ducts to the upstairs and downstairs bathrooms and all the bedrooms, plus one long run along the middle of the downstairs, such that air could be blown directly (i.e., efficiently) into the living room, dining room, and kitchen.

Les Revennaugh was tasked with building bulkheads to hide the ductwork downstairs. He was also engaged to take down the wall between the two front bedrooms, making it a much bigger room with better cross ventilation. Some of the space created by the newly enlarged bedroom was used to expand the bathroom, adding about 18 inches between the toilet and the sink. The bathroom was upgraded with a lot of new stuff—toilet, vanity, and storage closet for towels. It looks great!

As with any home improvement project, as the project advanced, new ideas emerged. One such suggestion was to paint the bedroom ceilings white, making the upstairs brighter, airy, and more inviting.

All involved in the improvements are pleased and proud of the outcome. You need to come see the improvements! **An Open House is being planned for the Memorial Day weekend**. Be on the look-out for the times closer to the holiday weekend.

NEWLYWEDS BUILD HOUSE IN LINWOOD

Here at Linwood, almost every winter someone rebuilds or remodels their cottage. Well, this year we watched a pair of newlyweds build their new home from scratch, stick by stick!!

Let us introduce you to Linn and Woody Bald Eagle!!! (trumpet sounds)

In January, the full-time residents of Linwood were so excited to discover a pair of bald eagles taking large and small branches to the top of an old majestic tree near the mailboxes on Linwood Street. Day by day, week by week, the nest grew from a few random branches to a sturdy nest approximately two feet high.

Although they continued to build and tend the nest, they did not have eaglets this year. Nevertheless, the joy of seeing one or both of them perched or sitting in the nest high above our heads as we come and go through the Linwood gate is a tremendous joy and wonderful blessing to our beloved Linwood Park.

Bald eagles mate for life and will keep the same nest as long as they live and the nest remains. They will add to it each nesting season, thus growing it larger and larger. After nesting season passes, the pair will seldom, if ever, return to the nesting spot. However, they will no doubt be present all year in the Park. Watch for them fishing, soaring, or perched on the highest lakefront trees on most days.

BALD EAGLE ETIQUETTE

Now that we have our own bald eagle nest in Linwood, we need to practice excellent bald eagle etiquette. These manners are most important during nesting season, which can range from February to June in Ohio. Please learn how to be *good neighbors* to our beautiful couple, Linn and Woody!

Stay back: Keep at least 100 feet from an active nest, roost, or feeding area. Use optics like binoculars or a telescope to view the eagles at a distance.

Quiet please: If you must talk, whisper.

Cover up: Use your vehicle or boat as a blind; eagles often are more alarmed by pedestrians.

Be cool: Avoid sudden movements — and movements directly toward the eagles or the nest — while on foot or in a vehicle or boat.

No flushing: Don't make the birds fly. Flushing an eagle off a nest may expose the eggs or young eaglets to cold or wet weather or a nest predator. It also wastes precious energy and may cause them to leave a valuable meal behind or abandon a nest that they are constructing.

Pay attention: Watch how the eagle reacts to your presence – if it acts agitated, vocalizes repeatedly, or starts moving away, you are too close.

Do not fly drones near nesting areas: Respect eagle zones. Drones will startle and agitate eagles. Eagles will defend nests and attack drones which can result in injury to the eagle.
